I told them, 'No!' because 99 I did not see that God answered their prayers. I suppose I need to be 100 prayed for, for I am conscious that I am a sinner; but I do not see that it 101 will do any good for you to pray for me; for you are continually asking, 102 but you do not receive.... You have prayed enough...to have prayed the 103 devil out of (this town) if there (were) any virtue in your prayers.' On 104 further reading of my Bible, it struck me that the reason their prayers were 105 not answered was because they did not comply with the revealed 106 conditions upon which God had promised to answer prayer; that they did 107 not pray in faith, in the sense of expecting God to give them the things 108 they asked for." "If you then being evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father who is in heaven give good things to those who ask Him."

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## 338 Andrew Murray

"God wills a great deal of blessing to His people, which never comes to 339 them. He wills it most earnestly, but they do not will it, and it cannot come 340 to them. This is the great mystery of man's creation with a free will, and 341 also of the renewal of his will in redemption, that God has made the 342 execution of His will, in many things, dependent on the will of man. 343 Prayer is the power by which things come to pass which otherwise would 344 not take place. (God) has left it to prayer to say where the blessing is to 345 bring the living water to the desert places; the will of God to bless is 346 dependent upon the will of man to say where the blessing must descend." 347 WCSP p. 167, 168 348

It covers the actual needs of all. One or two minutes is long enough for any ordinary prayer."

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## Unknown Christian

"We want every Christian to ask, 'Have I ever fairly tested prayer?' How long is it since you last offered up a definite prayer? .... Most Christians do not give God a chance to show His delight in granting His children's petitions, for their requests are vague and indefinite." Kneeling Christian, p. 43

#### <u>F. B. Meyer</u> (1847-1929)

"(Elijah's) prayer was definite. This is where so many prayers fail. They are shot like arrows into the air. They are like letters which require no answer, because they ask for nothing. They are like the firing by artillery in a mimic fight, when only gunpowder is employed. This is why they are so wanting in power and interest. We do not pray with any expectation of attaining definite and practical results. Let us keep a list of petitions, which we shall plead before God. Let us direct our prayers, as David did (Psalm V. 3), and look up for the answer; and we shall find ourselves obtaining new and (unexpected) blessings. Be definite!" *Elijah*, p. 95.

#### Andrew Murray

"Our prayers must not be a vague appeal to His mercy, an indefinite cry for blessing, but the distinct expression of definite need. Some cry for mercy, but take not the trouble to know what mercy must do for them. Others ask, perhaps to be delivered from sin, but do not begin by naming any sin from which deliverance may be claimed. Still others pray for God's blessing on those around them or on their land, and yet have no distinct situation where they wait and expect to see the answer. To all the Lord says: 'And what is it now you really want and expect me to do?" With Christ in the School of Prayer, p. 56.

"My life is one long, daily, hourly record of answered prayer for physical health, for mental overstrain, for guidance given marvelously, for errors and dangers averted, for enmity to the Gospel subdued, for food provided at the exact hour needed, for everything that goes to make up life and my poor service. They ascend not in spotless purity, and unless the Intercessor, who is at God's right hand, presents and purifies all by His righteousness, it is not acceptable to God. All incense from earthly tabernacles must be moist with the cleansing drops of the blood of Christ. He holds before the Father the censer of His own merits, in which there is no taint of earthly corruption. He gathers into this censer the prayers, the praise, and the confessions of His people, and with these He puts His own spotless righteousness. We must not pray and then run away as though afraid we should receive 526 an answer. God will not mock us. He will answer if we watch unto prayer, 527 if we believe we receive the things we ask for, and keep believing and 528 never lose patience in believing. This is watching unto prayer. We guard 529 the prayer of faith with expectancy and hope. We must wall it in with 530 assurance and be not faithless, but believing. The fervent prayer of the 531 righteous is never lost. The answer may not come according as we 532 expected, but it will come, because God's word is pledged. 533

## A Final Thoughts

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## Gospel Workers, p. 113

"I saw that the servants of God and the church were too easily discouraged. When they asked their Father in heaven for things which they thought they needed, and these did not immediately come, their faith wavered, their courage fled, and a murmuring feeling took possession of them. This, I saw, displeased God. Every saint who comes to God with a true heart, and sends his honest petitions to him in faith, will have his prayers answered. Your faith must not let go of the promises of God, if you do not see or feel the immediate answer to your prayers. Be not afraid to trust God. Rely upon his sure promise, "Ask, and ye shall receive." [John 16:24.] God is too wise to err, and too good to withhold any good thing from his saints that walk uprightly. Man is erring, and although his petitions are sent up from an honest heart, he does not always ask for the things that are good for himself, or that will glorify God. When this is so, our wise and good Father hears our prayers, and will answer, sometimes immediately; but he gives us the things that are for our best good and his own glory. God gives us blessings; if we could look into his plan, we would clearly see that he knows what is best for us, and that our prayers are answered. Nothing hurtful is given, but the blessing we need, in the place of something we asked for, that would not be good for us, but to our hurt. I saw that if we do not feel immediate answers to our prayers, we should hold fast our faith, not allowing distrust to come in, for that will separate us from God. If our faith wavers, we shall receive nothing from him. Our confidence in God should be strong; and when we need it most, the blessing will fall upon us like a shower of rain."

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\*Let's think about this matter of the body for a moment.

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Let's consider our hands. Would you be willing to go without one of your hands? Would you be willing to go without both of your hands? What about one of the feet? That's absurd you say. We need all of our limbs? Do we ever suggest that we can get by without one of our "limbs" so to speak in the church?

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Then let's consider the direction of the body. Does the hand try to convince the other limbs of the body to work in a particular way? Does the right leg try to convince the other limbs to do what it does? Of course not. Success comes as each limb looks to the head for direction. The head working in its amazing way coordinates the work of all the parts. Right? Of course. What do we learn about unity from this "looking to the head for direction" data?

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What about this. When you were doing construction last time, and you hammered the end of your thumb instead of the nail, did you nonchalantly say, "That's okay it's just a tiny bit of my body." Of course not. Your whole body reacted to the pain. In fact the whole body spent time protecting that injured limb in a special way for the time it took for it too heal, and took pains to make sure the injury wasn't repeated.

- A group covenanted to pour out their hearts in prayer.
- The Holy Spirit was sent down on them August 13, 1727.

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## \*Continuing Efforts

On August 26, 48 members covenanted to continue praying at one hour intervals; 77 more joined them later. Moravian children soon started their own groups.

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"They had quit judging each other because they had become convinced, each one, of his lack of worth in the sight of God and each felt himself at this communion to be in view of the noble countenance of the Saviour. In this view of the man of sorrows and acquainted with grief, their hearts told them that He would be their patron and their priest who was at once changing their tears into the oil of gladness and their misery into happiness. This firm confidence changed them in a single moment into a happy people..." (written of the August 13, 1727 experience)

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## The Long-term Outcome:

- Became marvelously united.
- Became a world-changing, mission-driven, community.
- Began a 100-year continuous prayer meeting!

### How does intercessory prayer work?

### \*1. Take up your God-given role.

1 Samuel 7:8 "Do not cease to cry out to the Lord...."

"God is waiting for those whom He can trust and use, who will have the discernment to foresee His steppings and the faith to command His power. Authoritative intercessors are men and women, whose eyes have been opened to the full knowledge of their place in Christ. To them the Word of God has become a battle chart on which is detailed the plan of campaign of the hosts of the Lord. They realize that they have been appointed by Him for the oversight of certain sections of the advance, and they have humbly accepted His commission. ..." J. A. MacMillan

# \*2. Make up a prayer list.

"Nash had remarkable power in prayer and was in the habit of making a 'praying list' of persons for whose conversion he daily prayed in secret. The answers to his prayers sometimes seemed almost miraculous, for he did not confine his 'list' to those whom he thought might be reached by the revival, but the most (challenging) and unlikely cases were made the subjects of prayer, with results that were truly astounding.... He prayed more and more; he used to take the map of the world before him, and pray, and look over the

different countries and pray for them, till he expired in his room, praying." Daniel Nash

\*3. Seek to understand the battle.

"Satan is ever ready to insinuate that prayer is a mere form, and avails us nothing. He cannot bear to have his powerful rival appealed to. At the sound of fervent prayer, the hosts of darkness tremble. Fearing their captive will escape, they form a wall around him, that heaven's light may not reach his soul. And when these angels, all-powerful, clothed with the armor of Heaven, come to the help of the fainting, pursued soul, the angels of darkness fall back, well knowing that their battle is lost, and that one more soul is escaping from the power of their influence." Your strength would not admit of your severe discipline. . . . I think that you have erred in fasting two days. God did not require it of you. I beg of you to be cautious and eat freely good, wholesome food twice a day. You will surely decrease in strength and your mind become unbalanced unless you change your course of abstemious diet." *Counsels on Diet & Foods*, p. 191

Such are not prospered and sustained in their voluntary acts of righteousness. They have a pharisaical religion which is not of Christ, but of themselves. They trust in their good works for salvation, vainly hoping to earn heaven by their meritorious works instead of relying, as every sinner should, upon the merits of a crucified, risen, and exalted Saviour. These are almost sure to become sickly. But Christ and true godliness are health to the body and strength to the soul." *Testimonies, Vol. 1*, p. 556

"Whenever it is necessary for the advancement of the cause of truth and the glory of God, that an opponent be met, how carefully, and with what humility, should they [The advocates of truth] go into the conflict. Especially I affectionately warn them against being led away by the device of Satan, to think that these things are peculiar to me, and cannot be enjoyed by all the children of God; for though, as has been stated before, every believer is not called upon to establish Orphan-Houses, Charity Schools, etc., and trust in the Lord for means, yet all believers are called upon, in the simple confidence of faith, to cast all their burdens upon Him, to trust in Him for everything, and not only to make every thing a subject of prayer, but to expect answers to their petitions which they have asked according to His will, and in the name of the Lord Jesus." George Muller

### Why Doesn't God Always Answer?

God's response to our prayers, or lack thereof, is sometimes a frustrating mystery. Charles Spurgeon, famed London preacher, found some individuals were immediately healed in response to his prayers, others were healed after a time; while other individuals immediately became more sick and died. He carefully studied the subject of healing prayer as a result, hoping to better understand the subject, but was never satisfied with the answers give by the various authors. According the following list is shared to explain some of the variability when praying for healing. It should also be noted that longevity and spirituality are not related (Gen. 5:23,24).

\*1. Sometimes the Great Controversy is being played out in the person's 2060 life. (Job 1:8-12) 2061

\*2. Sickness can be a disguised blessing and teach ongoing dependence. (2 2063 Cor. 12:7) 2064

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\*3. Sickness can be for God's glory. (John 9:1-12)

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\*4. Sickness can bring a knowledge of God that would not otherwise be possible (2 Kings 5:1-27)

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\*5. Sickness allows a person to experience and promote God's power in a personal way. (Daniel 4:29-35)

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\*6. Lack of answers can be due to a failure to believe. (Matt. 8:13; Luke 17:11-19)

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"Our Lord has given us definite instruction, through the apostle James, as to our duty in case of sickness. When human help fails, God will be the helper of His people. If the professed followers of Christ would, with purity of heart exercise as much faith in the promises of God as they repose in satanic agencies, they would realize, in soul and body, the life-giving power of the Holy Spirit...." *Counsels on Health*, p. 457

\*7. Healing is not always in the person's best interest. (Hezekiah, 2 Kings 20:1- [but especially 15-18])

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"All that can be done in praying for the sick is to earnestly importune God in their behalf, and rest their case in his hands, in perfect confidence.... When we come to him we should pray that we might enter into, and accomplish, his purpose, and that our desires and interests might be lost in his.... We have united in earnest prayer around the sick bed of men, women and children, and have felt in regard to our earnest prayers, they were given us back from the dead. In these prayers we thought we must be positive, and if we exercised faith, we must ask for nothing less than life. We dared not say, If it would glorify God, fearing it would admit a semblance of doubt. We have interestedly and anxiously watched these cases, which have been given back, as it were, from the dead. We have seen some of these, especially youth, raised to health, and forget God, become dissolute in life, causing sorrow and anguish to parents and friends. They lived not to honor and glorify God, but to curse him with their life of vice, and a shame to those who feared to pray. If their life can glorify Thee, let them live, nevertheless not as we will, but as Thou wilt. We no longer mark out a way, nor seek to bring the Lord to our wishes. Our faith can be just as firm, and more reliable, by committing the desire to the all-wise God, and trusting, with unfeverish anxiety, all in perfect confidence with him. We have the promise. We know that he hears us if we ask according to his will."

### \*Methods...

1. Is it always necessary to do a laying on of hands?

In the book of Acts there are instances recorded where the mere shadow of the Apostles falling on the person brought healing. At other times, a piece of clothing seemed to be sufficient.

#### 2. Should oil be used?

Oil wasn't always used, but one should remember that the oil represents the work of the Holy Spirit that brings about the healing.

### 3. Should elders be present?

Healing isn't a solo sport. To safeguard against this danger, I believe God has directed the calling of the "elders." However, I have seen people other than elders used to bring healing to another person.
